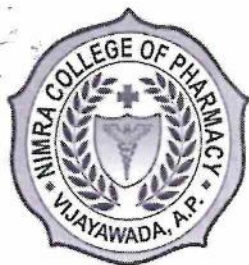
Objective of the program:
