



More specifically, it is the study of the interactions that occur between organisms and chemicals that affect normal or abnormal biochemical function. If substances have medicinal properties, they are considered medicinal products. Subject areas include drug composition and properties, synthesis and drug design, molecular and cellular mechanisms, organ/system mechanisms, signalling/cellular communication, molecular diagnostics, interactions, chemical biology, therapy, medical applications. The two main areas of pharmacology are pharmaco dynamics and pharmacokinetics. Pharmaco dynamics studies the effects of drugs on biological systems, and pharmacokinetics studies the effects of biological systems on drugs. In general, pharmaco dynamics discusses biological receptors and chemicals, and pharmacokinetics discusses Absorption, Distribution, Metabolism and Excretion (ADME) of chemicals from biological systems.

#### Objective of the program:

This program is basically for importance of pharmacology applications in pharmacy More specifically, it is the study of the interactions that occur between organisms and chemicals that affect normal or abnormal biochemical function. if substances have medicinal properties, they are considered medicinal products. Subject areas include drug composition and properties, synthesis and drug design, molecular and cellular signalling/cellular organ/system mechanisms, molecular diagnostics, interactions, chemical biology, therapy, medical applications. the two main areas of pharmacology are pharmaco dynamics and pharmacokinetics. pharmaco dynamics studies the effects of drugs on biological systems, and pharmacokinetics studies the effects of biological systems on drugs. in general, discusses biological receptors chemicals, dynamics and pharmaco pharmacokinetics discusses absorption, distribution, metabolism and excretion (ADME) of chemicals from biological systems. Pharmacology, a biomedical science, is involved in the study, discovery, and characterization of chemicals that exhibit biological effects, and the elucidation of cellular and biological functions associated with those chemicals. in contrast, pharmacies, as specialists in medical services, are interested in applying the principles learned from pharmacology to their clinical environment. in both areas, the main difference
